Multiconductor cables can be installed in a single layer or stacked, but ampacity derating must be applied if multiple layers are used. Ladder trays are preferred for power cables because their open design allows better ventilation and easier installation. Separation and Safety Considerations High-power and low-power cables must be separated to avoid electromagnetic interference (EMI). Cable trays must remain accessible and cannot be installed in hoistways or enclosed spaces. Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors if properly bonded. Outdoor installations require sunlight-resistant cables and expansion splice plates to accommodate thermal expansion. Practical Tips Always calculate the total cross-sectional area of cables before installation. Use cable ties or spacers to maintain proper spacing and prevent sagging. Follow NEC fill tables for ampacity adjustments, especially when stacking or bundling cables. Ensure maintenance access by leaving at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above the tray.
