

Cable tray connection pressure plate



AI Overview

Cable tray pressure plates are installed to secure and join tray sections, ensuring a stable and compliant cable management system.

Tools and Materials

Secure the Plates Insert bolts through the holes in the pressure plate and tray flanges. Tighten nuts using a wrench or torque wrench to ensure a firm connection. Standard splice plates may require multiple bolts for a strong hold.
Check Support Spacing Ensure that supports are installed within the recommended distance (typically 1.5 meters or 5 feet for standard trays, or 600 mm on both sides for flexible plates) to comply with NEMA VE2 and NEC guidelines.
Final Inspection Verify that all bolts are tight, trays are level, and the connection is secure. Ensure there is no sagging or misalignment that could compromise cable support.

Tips for Safe and Efficient Installation
Wear appropriate PPE, including gloves, safety glasses, and a hard hat.
Deburr any cut edges to prevent cable damage.
Use bonding jumpers only if required by your local electrical code; some flexible plates do not require them.
For long runs or heavy loads, consider additional supports to prevent sagging. By following these steps, cable tray pressure plates can be installed securely, providing...
