Connection Methods

Active Connection (Plug-and-Play Connectors) This method uses standard fiber optic connectors to join cables to devices or patch panels. It is flexible, convenient, and reliable, commonly used in data centers and building networks. Typical attenuation is around 1 dB per connection, and light loss can range from 10% to 20%, but it allows easy reconfiguration without specialized tools.

Emergency Connection (Cold Splicing) Cold splicing uses mechanical and chemical methods to bond fibers temporarily. It is quick and reliable for short-term use, with attenuation of 0.1–0.3 dB per point. Mechanical cold splicing involves placing fiber ends in a sleeve and clamping them, taking about 5 minutes per connection.

Permanent Fiber Connection (Fusion Splicing) Fusion splicing melts and fuses fiber ends using an electric arc, creating a nearly permanent connection. It has the lowest attenuation (0.01–0.03 dB per point) and is ideal for long-distance or high-reliability networks. This method requires a fusion splicer and professional operation, and the connection points must be protected in special containers.

Non-Splicing Physical Connection Advanced physical connections use V-groove designs and matching liquids to achieve nearly 100% fusion success. This method is suitable for FTTR (Fiber to the Room) solutions and provides a permanent, high-quality connection.

SC (Subscriber Connector): Square shape, push-pull coupling, widely used in FTTH and data centers. SC/APC is preferred for low return loss applications.

LC (Lucent Connector): Miniaturized 1.25 mm ferrule, latch mechanism, ideal for high-density patch panels...
