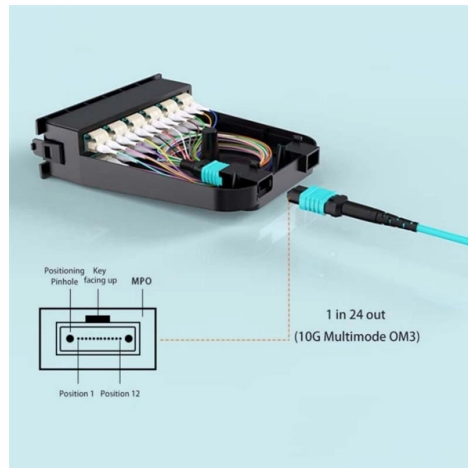


Fiber Optic Terminal Box Plug

Insert the fiber cable into the terminal box and connect each core to a pigtail. The pigtail is pre-connectorized and will be fused to the fiber inside the box. Plug the pigtail connectors into the corresponding fiber adapters on the terminal box. These adapters serve as the user-facing interface for connecting devices or patch cords.

Step 5: Manage Slack and Routing Route the fibers inside the box carefully, avoiding sharp bends or tight loops. Store any excess fiber in controlled loops within the splice tray to prevent microbending and signal loss. Label each connection clearly to identify which fiber corresponds to which port or device.

Step 6: Test the Connections After all fibers are connected, use a fiber optic power meter or tester to verify signal quality. Ensure all connections are stable, and there is no significant signal loss. Check that the fibers do not move when lightly tugged.
