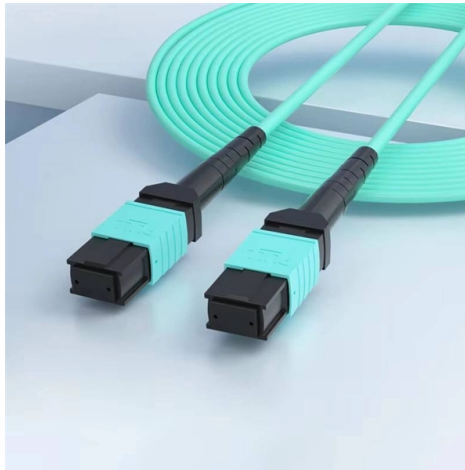

The most widely used connector types include: SC (Subscriber Connector): Square-shaped, push-pull coupling, commonly used in FTTH and GPON networks. SC/APC variants provide low return loss for high-performance applications. LC (Lucent Connector): Smaller 1.25mm ferrule, ideal for high-density setups, with a latch mechanism similar to RJ45 plugs. Other types include ST, FC, and MTP/MPO connectors, often used in data centers or multi-fiber applications. Connecting Fiber to a Router Install the ONT: Connect the fiber drop cable from the wall outlet to the ONT's optical port. Handle connectors carefully to avoid dirt or damage, aligning the key or tab until it clicks securely. Link ONT to Router: Use a Cat6a or higher Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's Ethernet port to your router's WAN port. Ensure the router supports gigabit speeds or higher to fully utilize fiber performance. Power and Configure: Power on the ONT and router, wait f...
