

HDMI fiber optic patch cord installed backwards

After Wall Completion: Once the cable is embedded in walls or conduits, reversing it becomes extremely difficult. Cutting and reconnecting fiber optic ends is not practical for HDMI fiber cables because they contain delicate optical fibers and integrated chips. In such cases, the recommended approach is to replace the cable with a correctly oriented one. Labeling and Verification: High-quality HDMI fiber optic cables usually have directional labels, color coding, or device icons to indicate TX and RX ends. Always verify the orientation before installation to prevent this issue. Testing: After installation, test the cable with the intended resolution (e.g., 4K@120Hz or 8K@60Hz) to ensure proper signal transmission.
