

How to fuse drop fiber optic cables

Cleaving Use a precision fiber cleaver to create a flat, perpendicular end-face on both fibers. Proper cleaving is essential to minimize signal loss and reflection.

Aligning and Splicing Place the fibers into the fusion splicer. The splicer aligns the fibers automatically using cameras or electrodes. Initiate the fusion process, which melts the fiber ends together using an electric arc, forming a continuous optical path.

Protecting the Splice Slide a splice protection sleeve over the fused fiber and heat it to secure the joint. This prevents mechanical damage and maintains long-term reliability.

Testing Use an optical time-domain reflectometer (OTDR) or power meter to verify the splice loss. Acceptable insertion loss is typically 0.01-0.1 dB for single-mode fibers.

Best Practices Maintain a clean workspace to avoid contamination. Handle fibers gently; maintain a minimum bending radius of 30 mm. Use manufacturer-recommended consumables to reduce failure rates. Follow industry standards such as ITU-T G.652 for single-mode fibers.
