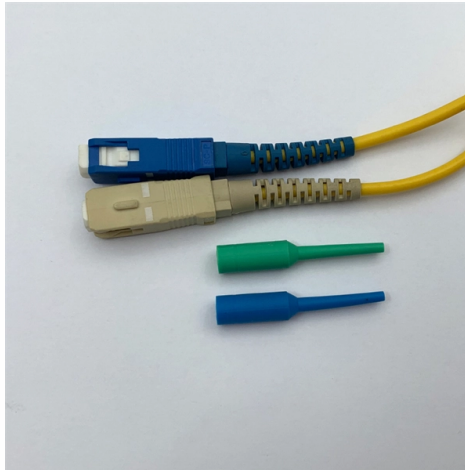


How to install a 2-in-1 junction box

Ensure all splices are tight and fully inside the box. For a 2-in-1 box, ensure each section or function is properly separated if the box has internal dividers.

Step 5: Seal and Test Push all wires neatly into the box, avoiding overstuffing. Install the cover plate, keeping it accessible for future inspection or maintenance. Turn the power back on and test the circuit to ensure proper operation.
