

Layer 3 core switches can be stacked



Overview

Utilizing two physical stacking ports on the back of each switch, a stack can provide for gateway redundancy at Layer 3 and dual-homing redundancy at Layer 2. Only a single uplink is required to provide connectivity to the stack once all stacking cables are installed. These features are available in all the releases subsequent to the one they were. Switch stacking allows several switches to be managed as a single, larger switch which can forward traffic over dedicated stack links rather than front-side network links. In some cases, power redundancy options are available for stacks to survive power supply failures as well. For information about license levels, see the System Management section of this guide.
