Weatherproof Boxes: Cast metal with threaded conduit ends, spring-hinged waterproof caps, and corrosion-proof fasteners . Distribution Boxes: Steel or plastic enclosures with appropriate IP or NEMA ratings, containing breakers, busbars, terminal blocks, and DIN rails for organized wiring . Wiring and Organization Inside the boxes, wires should be grouped by type (grounds, neutrals, hots) to simplify installation and maintenance. In panel boxes, ground wires are installed first, followed by neutrals, and hot wires last. Proper phasing and layering help prevent hazards and maintain load balance . Cable sheathing should extend slightly into the box, and unused knockouts should be capped to maintain safety . Layout Considerations Spacing: Maintain consistent spacing between boxes for convenience and code compliance. Accessibility: Ensure boxes are reachable for maintenance without removing permanent fixtures. Coordination: Align box locations with architectural fe...
