Cable Selection: For installation near high-voltage power lines, dielectric cables like ADSS are preferred to prevent electrical interference. Armored cables may be used for mechanical protection in exposed areas.

Installation Practices: Maintain proper cable sag to accommodate thermal expansion and contraction (e.g., 2.5-foot sag for a 150-foot span). Use service loops for maintenance and future expansion. Segregate fiber from heavy copper or power cables to avoid crush or bend radius violations. Employ UV-resistant jackets and water-blocking layers to protect against environmental damage.
