Key points: Each injector typically powers a single device, so multiple devices require multiple injectors. The injector requires its own power source. This setup allows a regular switch to transmit both data and power, effectively making it PoE-ready without replacing the switch. Alternatively, a PoE splitter can be used at the device end if the device does not natively support PoE, separating the power and data for use with non-PoE devices. Practical Considerations Using a PoE switch is generally cleaner and more scalable for multiple devices, as it centralizes power management and reduces cabling complexity. Regular switches with injectors are suitable for small deployments or when only a few PoE devices need to be powered.
