 - Mechanical Fasteners:** For heavier boxes or dense blocks, use Tapcons, plastic anchors, or expansion bolts. Drill pilot holes with a hammer drill and insert anchors before securing the box with screws.
- Conduit Routing** Use standard electrical conduits, routed vertically or horizontally along block joints. Avoid deep removal of load-bearing sections. AAC's soft texture allows easy chasing with hand tools or oscillating cutters, minimizing material wastage and preserving thermal and acoustic properties.
