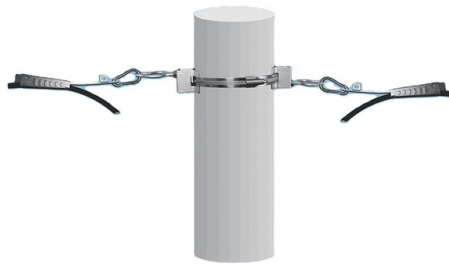

IK07: Resistance to mechanical impact, preventing damage from accidental knocks or tools.

Mounting and Installation Frames can be wall-mounted, floor-standing, or modular, depending on the project requirements. They often include pre-drilled mounting points and flange technology for tool-free assembly, simplifying installation and reducing labor time.
