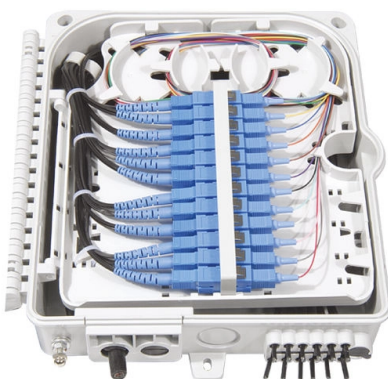

Older homes: Some older homes may have ungrounded outlets or panels, particularly if the wiring predates grounding code requirements. In these cases, metal boxes may still provide grounding through mounting hardware, but this is not guaranteed. Metal vs Plastic Boxes Metal boxes: Must be connected to the system ground. Ground wires are typically attached using a green grounding screw or metal clip to bond the box to the grounding conductor. Plastic boxes: Do not require a ground wire unless they contain metallic components or fixtures that need grounding. How to Identify or Connect a Ground Wire Open the distribution box and locate the grounding bar or PE bar, usually marked inside the panel. Connect the copper ground wire from the power supply to the grounding bar, ensuring a secure connection with a screw. If grounding individual components (like breakers or metal fixtures), connect them to the PE bar using yell...
