Core Switch Function A core switch is a high-capacity, high-performance Layer 3 switch positioned at the backbone of a network. Its primary role is to aggregate traffic from distribution switches and provide ultra-fast packet forwarding across the network, ensuring low latency and high throughput. Core switches handle internal routing within the LAN and act as the central aggregation point, but they are not automatically the exit point for a subnet. Gateway Function A gateway serves as the exit point for a subnet, connecting it to other networks or the internet. It typically manifests as a VLAN interface (VLANIF) or a router interface configured for Layer 3 forwarding. Gateways interpret and forward traffic between different network segments or protocols, which is a distinct function from the high-speed switching performed by core switches. When a Core Switch Can Act as a Gateway In some enterprise networks, especially in collapsed core architectures, a core switch may host VLAN interfaces and act as the default gateway for connected subnets. This is more common in large networks where the core switch is Layer 3 capable and the network design consolidates distribution and core functions. However, in traditional three-tier designs, the aggregation layer usually provides the default gateway, while the core switch focuses on high-speed backbone switching. Key Distinction Core Switch: Primarily for high-speed internal routing and aggregation within the LAN; may support Layer 3 routing but not necessarily configured as a gateway. Gateway: Always serves as the exit point for a subnet, enabling communication with other networks or the internet. In summary, a core switch can function as a gateway if configured to host VLAN interfaces, but its default role is backbone switching and routing, not acting as the subnet exit point.
