What is Optical Fiber? An optical fiber is a thin, flexible strand made of glass or plastic designed to transmit light signals over long distances with minimal signal loss. It consists of three main components:

- Core:** The innermost part where light travels, with a higher refractive index than the surrounding cladding.
- Cladding:** Surrounds the core and reflects light back into it through total internal reflection.
- Buffer Coating:** Provides basic protection against minor physical damage.

Optical fibers are extremely delicate and brittle, making them unsuitable for direct use in most environments without additional protection.

What is an Optical Cable? An optical cable (or fiber optic cable) is a structured assembly that contains one or more optical fibers bundled together within protective layers. These layers include:

- Strength Members:** Materials like aramid yarn that provide tensile strength.
- Outer Jacket:** A plastic or polymer sheath that protects against moisture, temperature changes, and physical stress.
- Optional Water-Blocking Materials:** Gel-filled tubes or other barriers to prevent water ingress.

The cable allows optical fibers to be installed in various environments, such as underground ducts, aerial lines, or indoor networks, while maintaining signal integrity.
