- Cable Handling:** Fiber optic cables are fragile. Avoid bending or damaging them, and ensure connectors match the ONT specifications (SC/APC or SC/UPC) to prevent signal loss.
- ISP Activation:** Your ISP may need to activate the fiber service on the ONT before the router can access the internet. Without activation, the router will not detect a connection.
- Troubleshooting:** If the router shows no connection, verify the ONT is powered, the Ethernet cable is functional, and the ISP has provisioned the service correctly. Directly connecting a computer to the ONT can help isolate router configuration issues.
- Alternative Options** If you prefer a direct fiber connection to your router, you would need a router with an SFP port or a fiber WAN...
