

What to do if the black sheath of a telecommunications fiber optic cable falls off

Apply a layer of vinyl electrical tape over the repair for additional protection.

Replacement Jacket For longer-term protection, consider sliding a new PE or HDPE jacket over the damaged section, especially for outdoor cables. Ensure the replacement jacket matches the original cable's environmental rating (e.g., UV, moisture, fire resistance) to maintain compliance with building codes.
